A secondary program consisting of middle school and high school students on the same campus is a more natural fit than a middle school on the grounds of an elementary.



Middle school and high school faculty both tend to be subject area specialists rather than generalists as are elementary teachers.

Middle school and high school schedules are similar with both having a 7-period day.



A combined secondary program allows middle school and high school faculty the opportunity work closely together, meet more regularly as subject area departments, and together develop a cohesive 7th -12th grade educational model.



While middle school students would have their own program of study and generally their own classes, they could combine with high school students for certain electives such as art, music, drama, and yearbook. Advanced math students would also have access to the high school's upper level math classes.



Middle school and high school students would combine naturally for chapel, assemblies, and activities providing a more robust and exciting experience for both.



More students provides for a more dynamic worship experience.

Combined middle school and high school programs have the potential to involve more students and draw more family members to concerts and programs creating a more enjoyable and expansive experience.

While middle school and high school students would continue to have their own athletic programs and leagues, having both groups on the same campus would add greater cohesion and opportunity for middle school and high school athletes.
