Parents, students, staff, alumni, and new friends, please join me in affirming Ps. 145:3, "Great is the Lord and most worthy of praise; his greatness no one can fathom." Let's pour out our praise. Consider the following praiseworthy anecdotes near the summit of my top-five list for 2018-19.

- Across our preK-12th grade ministry, at least 56 students confessed Jesus as Lord for the first time or rededicated their lives. Thank you, Lord.
- **2.** S.T.E.A.M. Maker Spaces—proof of concept. Students in grades 3-8 discovered, explored, and showcased their God-given talents in science, technology, engineering, art, and math.
- 3. RCHS retooling effort completed with <u>Interest and Gift Pathways</u> and <u>RCHS Course Catalogue</u> Five new high-school classes and six internships are offered for 2019-2020.
- 4. Community Impact Day—two outreach efforts. Northwest Harvest volunteer supervisor, Lonnie Johnson, exclaimed, "Rainier Christian Rocks!" RCHS students and staff poured, packed, and boxed 4,250 lbs. of oats to be distributed across 395 state food banks. Secondly, Black Diamond Camps Executive Director, Doug Sweet, shared RCHS students and staff contributed over \$5000 dollars in labor. Our in-kind labor translates into 20 full-paid scholarships for families unable to afford summer camp. RCHS students and staff's sweat equity stretched the capacity of two organizations in one day.
- 5. The Booster Club Returns—our Booster Club funded three needs for RCS athletics and sports-of-the mind teams: July 2019 National Speech and Debate Tournament, subsidized new football jerseys, and purchased trophies for the annual sports award's recognition.
