A biblical theme traced to the book of Proverbs shows that lessons for children are often caught more than taught. In closing, I want to thank many of you, including the campus prayer teams, for interceding for me. The existence of RCS belongs in part to a committed group of people who prayed and believed in God's provision. God answered their prayers in miraculous ways. Their practice offers up a prototypical model for miracles today. Dr. Ray Pritchard of Keep Believing Ministries aided my understanding from his February 22, 2009 sermon based on Hebrews 11:33-38.

"Christianity is a religion of miracles. Take the miraculous out of our faith and you are left with nothing but a set of ethical instructions that has no power to change the heart. Remember that miracles come in many different varieties. I had a friend with cancer who prayed and prayed that he might be healed. Eventually, he decided that he would not pray that way anymore, not because he thought it was wrong but because he asked himself, "Will God be glorified more by my healing or by my faith being strong even if I am not healed?" Great question, exactly the right way to look at it, and only God knows the answer. So he prayed that God would be glorified whether by healing him or by giving him strength to keep believing no matter what. That strikes me as the right biblical balance."

Will God be glorified more? That is a question and a stance that stretches my faith. He is God, and I am not. Again, thank you for your prayers during this season.

On May 5, RCS marks the National Day of Prayer at each campus. I am calling us to carve out time on that day to pray. Remember our teachers and the staffing needs for next year before the Lord. May our individual and collective prayer advance God's kingdom through the ministry of Rainier Christian Schools.
